

## CHRONOLOGICAL TABLE

* 24 October 1415	Henry V wins the battle of Agincourt
10 September 1419	Assassination of John the Fearless at Montereau
* 21 May 1420	Treaty of Troyes between Henry V and Charles VI
31 August 1422	Death of Henry V
21 October 1422	Death of Charles VI
* c.1425	Joan first hears voices
* 15 May 1428	Joan's first meeting with Robert de Baudricourt
* 12 October 1428	Beginning of the siege of Orléans by the English
* 4 March 1429	Joan arrives at Chinon
* March-April 1429	Joan questioned by the theologians at Poitiers
* 29 April 1429	Joan enters Orléans
* 8 May 1429	The English withdraw from the siege of Orléans
11-12 June 1429	Jargeau falls to French
17 June 1429	Beaugency falls to French
18 June 1429	Defeat of the English at the battle of Patay
17 July 1429	Charles VII crowned as king of France at Reims
16 August 1429	The aborted battle at Montépilloy between French and English armies
* 8 September 1429	Joan leads the <u>unsuccessful assault</u> on Paris
Late October 1429	The attack upon Saint-Pierre-le-Moûtier
24 November 1429	Joan lays siege to La Charité-sur-Loire
* 28 May 1430	Joan captured at Compiègne
* 23 December 1430	Joan arrives at Rouen
* 9 January 1431	Start of the heresy trial
- 19 May 1431	The University of Paris condemns Joan
- 24 May 1431	Joan is pushed into abjuring her crimes
- 28 May 1431	Joan is charged with relapsing into heresy
- 30 May 1431	Joan is burned at the stake
16 December 1431	Henry VI is crowned king of France in Paris
21 September 1435	Treaty of Arras between Charles VII and the Duke of Burgundy
13 April 1436	Paris recaptured by Charles VII
November 1440	Charles, Duke of Orléans released by the English
29 October 1449	Rouen recaptured by Charles VII
* February 1460	Preliminary inquiry into the Rouen trial led by Guillaume Bouillé
May 1452	Canonical investigation into the Rouen trial led by Cardinal Guillaume d'Estouteville
* 7 November 1455	Opening of the Nullification trial
* 7 July 1466	The judges at the Nullification trial issue their sentence
* 1920	Joan is canonised
